Scotland's leading pianist, Gusztáv Fenyő, received high acclaim in 1990 for his cycles of Beethoven's 32 Piano Sonatas in Glasgow and Edinburgh. He has also been praised for his performances and recordings of works by Chopin and Liszt. A descendant of the great Hungarian violinist Joseph Joachim, he spent his formative years in South America and Australia where, at the age of 18, he won the Australian Broadcasting Commission's Concerto Competition playing Liszt's First. He subsequently studied in London and at the Liszt Academy in Budapest. Since his London (Wigmore Hall) debut in 1978, Gusztáv Fenyő has given many recitals of the solo and chamber repertoire and appeared as soloist with major orchestras in the UK, Australia and Europe; his USA debut followed in 1993. From 1980 to 1992 Gusztáv Fenyő was Lecturer of Piano at the Royal Scottish Academy of Music and Drama and in 1995 he inaugurated a new summer school and festival of chamber music at Ayton Castle, Berwickshire.
