Continuing the anniversary tributes to Franz Schubert (1797-1828) and Johannes Brahms (1893-1897), Gusztáv Fenyő will play works from both composers' mature years. Each programme provides a contrast of mood and scale.

A descendant of the great Hungarian violinist and friend of Brahms, Joseph Joachim, Gusztáv Fenyő received high acclaim for his cycles of Beethoven's 32 Piano Sonatas in Glasgow and Edinburgh in 1990. He studied in Sydney, London and Budapest and won the Australian Broadcasting Commission's Concerto Competition playing Liszt's First at the age of 18. Since his Wigmore Hall début in 1978, Gusztáv Fenyő has given many performances in the UK, Australia, Europe and North America. His recordings include Chopin, Liszt and Bartók. He is Artistic Director of Summer Music at Ayton Castle, an annual summer school and festival of chamber music in the Scottish Borders.
