GUSZTÁV FENYŐ, a descendant of the great Hungarian violinist Joseph Joachim, has performed extensively throughout Scotland since his appointment as Lecturer of Piano at the Royal Scottish Academy of Music and Drama in 1980. He has also made several recital and concerto tours of Australia and New Zealand and has performed in France, Hungary, Italy and Spain. Since his London debut at the Wigmore Hall in 1978 he has appeared with the Philharmonia and BBC Scottish Symphony Orchestras. His many performances of chamber music include the complete Beethoven piano trios, Mozart and Beethoven Wind Quintets with the Budapest Wind Ensemble and all the Beethoven violin sonatas with Angus Anderson during Glasgow's 1989 Mayfest season. He broadcasts for the BBC and has made commercial records of solo works by Chopin and Liszt.

The complete cycle of Beethoven Piano Sonatas is being performed concurrently by Gusztáv Fenyő on Friday nights in Glasgow at the Royal Scottish Academy of Music and Drama.

The Queen's Hall is situated on the west side of Clerk Street just north of the junction with Hope Park Terrace, 15 minutes' walk from Princes Street. A number of buses pass the door and there is a large car park off St. Leonard's Street just 3 minutes' walk from the hall.

The Queen's Hall Restaurant is open Monday to Saturday 10am-5pm and both **Bar** and **Restaurant** are open before concerts from 6pm. The Bar remains open after concerts.

There are a number of facilities for the **Disabled** including a toilet at Stalls level, ramps front and back for wheelchair users, an induction loop and a specially lowered telephone. Wheelchairs can be accommodated in the Centre or Side Stalls by the removal of certain seats (please arrange this with The Queen's Hall Box Office in advance Tel: 031-668 2019).
